"Merging Clay: India and Celadon City Chronicles" showcases the outcome of a three-month residency that brought together 18 Indian artists at the WangouTaoxichuan Art Center, Longquan, China, under the curatorship of Mr. Vinod Daroz.

Longquan, a town celebrated for its centuries-old carving techniques and famed celadon ceramic glazes, became a vibrant hub of creative exchange. Artists immersed themselves in its cultural and material heritage, bridging ancient traditions with contemporary sensibilities. This residency echoed the historical Silk Road, fostering dialogue between India and China's distinct yet interconnected artistic traditions. The collaboration blended Longquan's celadon expertise with each artist's modern approaches, resulting in works that span intricate vessels to abstract installations.

The collection captures the interplay of tradition and innovation, reflecting the artists' engagement with Longquan's legacy and their own cultural identities. While some pieces pay homage to celadon's timeless beauty, others transform the medium into tools for storytelling and self-expression. Through this exhibition, viewers are invited to explore how cross-cultural exchanges enrich artistic traditions and resonate in today's interconnected world. "Merging Clay" celebrates the evolving narratives and cultural synergies that arise when artists immerse themselves in environments that challenge and inspire.

Nidhi Chopra, Bhopal





He is a member of the International Academy of Ceramics (IAC), Geneva, and the International Ceramic Artists Association, Zibo, China. Vinod has received multiple awards, including the National Scholarship for Young Artists, AIFACS Award for Best Potter of the Year, and the Charles Wallace India Trust Award. His artistic journey has taken him to various residencies and exhibitions worldwide, including the Wang Ou Taoxichuan International Studio in China and the Jingdezhen International Ceramic Art Biennale. Vinod's work is inspired by traditional Indian art and architecture, blending symbolism and meditative repetition. His use of gold and copper glazes reflects his family's jewellery-making heritage. Through motifs like lotuses and forms inspired by the lingam and yoni, Vinod explores universal oneness and the balance of male and female energies. His art is a contemplative pursuit of nature's power and the fundamental essence of life.
